14. Mumps, Meningitis Associated with MMR Vaccine

14.1 The Committee noted Professor Collee's oral report of the Biologicals Sub-Committee meeting and concluded that they were re-assured as to the safety of the vaccines.

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- 14.2 The Committee noted that there had been ten cases for mumps meningitis following meningitis reactions of MMR vaccination of which three were causally related to the MMR vaccine, set against 2.5 million doses in the UK.
- 14.3 The Committee noted that the ARVI Sub-Committee would continue to monitor the position and that Professor Collee would report to the Committee as and when necessary.
